Literature, Film, and Urban Landscape</i></p> <p>The class focuses on the German capital, Berlin, one of the largest and most frequently visited cities in Europe. Berlin is a city that changed and reinvented itself several times in the 20th century, reflecting the turbulent history of Europe. By exploring a few examples of text and visual narratives about historical and present Berlin, students will create their own topographies of the city: create mental maps of existing or destroyed buildings, stores, squares, and parks, and confront them with the actual urban landscape.
