GREEN CERTIFICATION INITIATIVE

An interview with Jordan, Dana, & Tenzin Namdol, The Green Cert Team

Can you describe what Green Certification is?

"Green Certification is an initiative to build more sustainable habits among students. There are two steps to get certified: First, fill out the Green Certification Checklist. Then, set up a time to meet with an EcoRep to go over your commitments. Once certified, you will receive a green patch or sticker, a door-cling for your room, and qualify to participate in periodic green challenges for cool prizes. Examples include a full car carpool contest over school breaks, and a recyclable art competition. Winners will receive prizes like gas cards and Nezinscot gift cards— stuff people want."

What is the rationale behind Green Certification?

"We know people will be skeptical if we tell them that a 5-minute shower will save the world. That's not what we're trying to say. Instead, the program encourages long-term sustainable habits, modeling these habits for peers, and in turn, the spread of a new, more sustainable norm on campus. "

Why do you think it's important to get Green Certified?

"Bates students know that climate change is a key issue and they talk about how nothing is being done. I do this. Everyone does this. We see Green Certification as a first step to show support, commitment to the issue, and a willingness to live more sustainably. It starts with each of us. It feels good to put actions behind words."

What happens if you don't get Green Certified?

"We will hunt you down, break your light bulbs, remove your showerheads, and take away your trash bins."
