

Chinese Major

1) Language:

Students with previous experience in Chinese who begin their study of Chinese at the second-year level may elect to fulfill this requirement with CHI 201–202, 301–302, 401–402 or the equivalent.

b One Advanced Chinese

- CHI 401, CHI 402, CHI 415, or CHI s42

CHI 401 and/or 402 may be used in fulfillment of either this requirement or (a) above but not both.

Courses Taken Abroad. Students may petition the program to have courses taken in their study abroad program applied toward the fulfillment of requirements (1a) and (2b).

Pass/Fail Grading Option. Pass/fail grading may not be elected for courses applied toward the Chinese major.

Advanced Placement. Students may receive credit for CHI 102 with a score of four on the Chinese Advanced Placement examination and CHI 201 with a score of five.

Restrictions on double-dipping. Majors and minors in Chinese may count no more than one course toward both the Asian Studies minor and their major.
