Courses on Japan and on China. Students must take at least two courses dealing primarily with China and two dealing primarily with Japan.

Courses Taken Abroad. Students may petition the program to have courses taken in their study abroad program applied toward the fulfillment of requirements except the Thesis Sequence.

Pass/Fail Grading Option. Pass/fail grading may not be elected for courses applied toward the Japanese major.

Advanced Placement. Students may receive credit for CHI 102 with a score of four on the Japanese Advanced Placement examination and CHI 201 with a score of five.

Restrictions on double-dipping. Majors in Chinese or Japanese may count no more than two courses toward both their major in East Asian Studies and their major in Chinese or Japanese. Minors in Japanese may count no more than one course toward both the East Asian Studies major and Japanese minor.
