Academic Advisors – Your academic advisor assists you in navigating the curriculum, discovering and deepening your academic interests, and in fulfilling your general education requirements. Your FYS instructor is your academic advisor until you declare a major. Upon major declaration, students receive an academic advisor in the major. If a student declares a minor, they also have an academic advisor in the minor.
