Job-Aid: Transport Assistant

- 1. Upon arrival check-in with Site Coordinator. Put on identification, review job aid, gather cleaning supplies, locate wheelchairs.
- 2. The tasks of transport volunteers include the following tasks:
 - a. Maintain awareness of vaccine clients that have mobility needs and politely offer assistance. Remember, many people with mobility needs are independent and navigate very well on their own. The only assistance needed might be wider pathways, open doors, a slower pace, etc.
 - b. As/If needed inform vaccine clients of the option to access mobility assistance this includes the use of a wheelchair or additional seating, and if needed a volunteer to accompany them through the entire vaccination process
 - c. Following wheelchair safety training provided on site, support vaccine clients requiring assistance with a wheelchair through the vaccination process
 - d. Accompany vaccine clients through the entire process as needed/requested.
 - e. Exercise exceptional customer service with all vaccine clients, clinic staff and volunteers and Mall patrons.
 - f. Advise Site Coordinator, security, or other designated staff of any incidents involving vaccine clients and escalate these incidents as needed
 - g. Prepare to be standing and pushing wheelchairs for the
 - h. duration of the shift
 - i. Clean wheelchairs after each patient has used them
 - j. Be prepared to stand long periods of time during the shift
 - k. Assist with setting up (beginning of shift) and breaking down (end of shift) signs, cleaning supplies, wheelchairs as needed.
 - I. Check out with Site Coordinator at end of shift.
