Background

Healthy Neighborhoods is a network of people who live in or love Downtown Lewiston. We are working to transform the Tree Streets neighborhood into a place that people choose to live, work, play, and invest in.

Our annual grant program aims to engage new and existing partners and to foster collaboration among volunteers, small and large organizations, institutions, and businesses. In past years these grants have sponsored neighborhood beautification projects including murals, flower boxes, and creative crosswalks; community events such as Trash Amnesty and the Kennedy Park Block Party; and creation of new public spaces such as the Pop-Up Garden on Bartlett Street and the Heart and Soil garden at Birch and Pierce Streets.

In light of the COVID-19 situation, we reached out to the community for feedback on how we could best support each other during this difficult time. Thank you for helping us revise this year's program to help as many neighbors as possible. Here are the details of the program:

Goals

- Streamline the process to get funds into the community as quickly as possible.
- Spread the funds across multiple organizations and needs to touch as many households as possible.
- Use the funds for **new expenses and projects** necessitated by the COVID-19 crisis; this includes payroll and operating expenses.

Process

- The maximum grant amount is \$2,500.
- All local community organizations with an established history of meaningful impact in the neighborhood may apply. Unaffiliated residents may partner with an organization to apply.
- We are accepting applications immediately; we will review and award funds in the order in which we receive the applications. Application review and notification could take as little as three days.
- Recipients of funds can re-apply for a second grant after 14 days; the maximum award per organization is \$5,000 (two \$2,500 grants).
- We will continue to accept applications and award grants until the pool of rapid response money runs out.
