



HOUSING SELECTION



The 2025-2026 Selection Breakdown

The following information is meant to help establish general expectations for any given class year for housing selection, by providing historical data from the previous year. Based on this data, a student could make adjustments to their plan for housing selection, given the estimated likelihood of ending up in any given building or room type. For example: a rising sophomore could note that only 10.6% of fall 2025's sophomore class got a single room assignment last year. It would therefore be wise for rising sophomores to have back-up plans in case there are no available singles at the time of that student's selection time.

This document provides data on self-selected placement by building and room type for selection last year. Rising seniors pick first, then rising juniors, and lastly rising sophomores. For a more detailed breakdown of types of room selected, please refer to the tables at the end of this document. This data only encompasses on-campus students and does not include the Fall Housing or Winter Housing Placement processes.

This breakdown does not serve as a guarantee of placement as the process changes from year to year and is based on what others select. It is simply a resource for students to help create realistic housing selection plans based on past results.


Seniors

Room Location

During last year's Selection, there was an even distribution of seniors across most housing options. As seniors select first, all of the housing options on campus are available at the beginning of this round. The data below suggests that student preference lies across the spectrum, and each building (or area on-campus) is appealing to a roughly even number of students.

Note the following:

- "Other Hall" includes John Bertram, Page, Parker, Rand, & Wentworth Adams
- "Other House" includes Cheney, Herrick, Mitchell, Nash, Stillman, Turner, Whittier, & Wood St. House
- "Village" includes: Moody (V1), Rzasa (V2), and Hopkins (V3)




Room Type

Single rooms are the most popular option for seniors. By looking at the similar charts for Juniors & Sophomores, you will see that some single rooms were still available for those class years as well. The Office of Residence Life does not hold any rooms for each round of Selection, so that means every incoming senior who wanted a single room, got a single room during last year's Selection. This is also in line with other past Selections.

Note the following:

- "Double" includes 2 Room Doubles (like those in Smith)
- "Triple" includes 3 Person Suites (like those in 10 Frye)
- "4 Person Suite" includes Singles and Doubles within the Suite, but is not broken down into subcategories




Juniors

Room Location

While not as even of a spread as the Senior chart, this data suggests that Juniors are able to find housing all across campus. Data of interest might include the jump in “Other Hall” numbers compared to the Senior class. This is typical for the Junior class, as the buildings listed under “Other Hall” have a solid number of single rooms in them. Typically, a large number of the Junior class is able to get a single room (as detailed below) but the singles are found in buildings other than Chu, Kalperis, and Gillespie, as those are typically selected by Seniors.

Note the following:

- “Other Hall” includes John Bertram, Page, Parker, Rand, & Wentworth Adams
- “Other House” includes Cheney, Herrick, Mitchell, Nash, Stillman, Turner, Whittier, & Wood St. House




Room Type

Single rooms are popular among the incoming Junior class. As detailed above, the singles most often selected by the incoming Junior class are found in "Other Halls". It is also noteworthy that about a quarter of the class ended up in double rooms.

Note the following:

- "Double" includes 2 Room Doubles (like those in Smith)
- "Triple" includes 3 Person Suites (like those in 10 Frye)
- "4 Person Suite" includes Singles and Doubles within the Suite, but is not broken down into subcategories
- "6 Person Suite" includes Singles and Doubles within the Suite, but is not broken down into subcategories




Sophomores

Room Location

Frye St. is very popular with the Sophomore class, as the data shows that Sophomores selected Frye St. locations at a rate of approximately 2:1 when compared to Seniors and Juniors **combined**. Also of interest is the high number of Sophomores selecting "Other Hall". The info is more detailed below, but the high numbers generally come from suites in John Bertram and double rooms in Wentworth Adams.

Note the following:

- "Other Hall" includes John Bertram, Page, Parker, Rand, & Wentworth Adams
- "Other House" includes Cheney, Herrick, Mitchell, Nash, Stillman, Turner, Whittier, & Wood St. House




Room Type

The vast majority of the Sophomore class can expect to live in a double room for their Sophomore year. Generally, less than 15% of Sophomores are able to select a single room and the data shows that is true for last year as well. So, while it's not impossible, it typically isn't wise to plan on having a single if you are a Sophomore. As touched upon above, the "4 Person Suite" number for incoming sophomores is primarily made up of John Bertram suites.

Note the following:

- "Double" includes 2 Room Doubles (like those in Smith)
- "Triple" includes 3 Person Suites (like those in 10 Frye)
- "4 Person Suite" includes Singles and Doubles within the Suite, but is not broken down into subcategories
- "6 Person Suite" includes Singles and Doubles within the Suite, but is not broken down into subcategories



Housing Selection Process 2025 Full Data Table

Total numbers may not reflect total class size or total beds available in each building and may also not exactly match what is currently available in this year's selection process. This is because of ResLife student staffing, spaces that are held for first year centers, abroad changes, etc. However, these numbers will generally provide guidance on what to expect during the Selection process.

The following tables give a more thorough breakdown of which types of rooms were selected in each building for each class year. The columns show the number of students living in each room type for each building.
