He received an AA from Riverside City College, BA in Liberal Arts from Portland State University, and MFA in Film, Video, Animation, and New Genres at the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee. Hopinka is Assistant Professor of Film and Electronic Arts at Bard College.
