## Please note the following guidelines:

- Students may count **no more than 2 100-level courses** and **no more than 2 short-term courses** toward the major. Only 1 100-level course can be applied to the major-concentration
- Students must take at least 2 300-level seminars, one of which <u>must</u> be within the student's major concentration
- An FYS course only if it is taught by a politics professor can count toward the major. It is considered
  a 100-level course (as such, if a student applies an FYS to the major, then they may only apply 1 100level course to the major)
- Students may count no more than 2 non-Bates courses (e.g., Global Education/Study Abroad) toward the major (and they can be applied to Category 3 or, at the Chair or Associate Chair's discretion, Category 2). Within this category of up to 2 courses not taught by Bates politics faculty, students may take 1 approved non-politics Bates course. - All courses in the major-concentration must be taken in the Bates politics curriculum
- 1 course in the major can be taken credit/no credit. However, this course can only be at the 100- or 200-level
