Choreographer & Dancer Biographies

Nell Shipman — Artistic and Executive Director

Nell Shipman began her training in Massachusetts and continued her studies in Indianapolis, Indiana with Marek Cholewa and Rosanna Ruffo. She holds a B.F.A. in Dance Performance with High Honors from Butler University and has performed and shown choreography throughout the United States and abroad. Ms. Shipman joined Portland Ballet as a dancer in 2004 before assuming the role of Artistic Director in 2015 and Director of Portland School of



Ballet in 2016. With Portland Ballet she performed many leading roles, including the title role in Giselle and the lead in Andrei Bossov's Carmina Burana. She has also appeared as guest artist with Portland Symphony Orchestra, Good Theater, Best of Broadway and Opera Maine. Ms. Shipman's evening length choreography includes a Victorian Nutcracker, The Armed Man: A Mass for Peace, Tales By Poe, The Legend of Sleepy Hollow, Firebird, A Midsummer Night's Dream, and Jack the Ripper. Her contemporary works include Four Seasons, Impetus, First Principles of Hope and Enjoyment, PushMePullYou, Somebody and Spoke of the Wheel to name a few. As an innovative and educational initiative, she created the Building Ballets Series for Portland School of Ballet, which has presented versions of well known classics Sleeping Beauty, Coppelia, Don Quixote and La Esmeralda. Ms. Shipman is currently a Visiting Instructor at Colby College and has created works in collaboration with many local and national arts organizations.

Jennifer Jones — Ballet Mistress

Jennifer Jones came to Portland after four seasons as a Principal Dancer with The Northwest Florida Ballet. Previous to dancing in Florida, she danced as a Soloist with Montgomery Ballet, and an Apprentice with Dance Connecticut. Her repertoire includes lead roles in Don Quixote, the Nutcracker, Coppelia, and



Balanchine's Concerto Barocco. Jennifer guested in Tennessee and Georgia and danced in Jean Grand-Maitre's Uroboros, Oskar Antunez's Gatsby, and Antunez's Alice in Wonderland. Her Portland Ballet credits include The Legend of Sleepy Hollow, By Request, A Victorian Nutcracker, A Midsummer Night's Dream, and the title role in Giselle. Jennifer danced with Portland Ballet from 2010-2020 and now serves as the company's Ballet Mistress.

Annie Kloppenberg

Annie Kloppenberg is Associate Professor and Chair of the Department of Performance, Theater and Dance at Colby College. Called "a choreographer of nuances" by the Boston Globe, and "a fierce, yet coy force of energy-contained or unleashed" by ThINKing Dance, her work as a teacher, performer, and choreographer has been presented nationally and internationally. Her creative and scholarly research are braided practices that hinge on collaboration and improvisation. Imperfect Unity and Productive Frictions: Ethics and Aesthetics of Play in Dance Improvisation, for example, included in a



transdisciplinary volume on the aesthetics of imperfection proposes a relationship between ethical and aesthetic dimensions of group improvisational practice in dance. For more than ten years, her improvisational trio, Like You Mean It, gave workshops, master classes, and performances at conferences, universities, and professional venues across the country; more recently her collaborative research platform Foreword/Afterword has generated conference presentations, workshops, and performances in a variety of contexts at home and abroad, from Philadelphia, and Miami to Instanbul and Vienna.

Choreographic commissions and residencies include The Portland Ballet, The Bates Dance Festival, The Boston Dance Alliance Fellowship at Mass MoCA, Summer Stages Dance at Concord Academy & ICA Boston, The Boston Center for the Arts, Dance Theater Workshop's Outer/Space, Dublin Arts Council with OhioDance and The Ohio State University, and the Taft School. Annie has performed in works by Lisa Race, Bebe Miller, Headlong Dance Theater, Kathleen Hermsdorf, Rachel Boggia, Sara Pearson & Patrik Widrig, Shani Collins, Rebecca Rice, Penny Campbell, Prometheus Dance, Cathy Young, Heidi Henderson (Colby '83), and Ashley Thorndike, among others.

Annie co-founded and curated the professional training program Moving Target Boston, is a past board member of Now and Next Dance Mentoring Project (Washington DC) and Green Street Studios (Cambridge, MA). She currently serves on the Board of the American College Dance Association, and as a faculty representative to the Colby Museum of Art Board of Governors and the Colby College Board of Trustees.

Kimberly Fletcher-Stibal

Kimberly Fletcher-Stibal graduated from The University of the Arts in Philadelphia, PA. with a BFA in jazz dance performance. While there, she received several scholarships and was selected as the outstanding senior artist and outstanding in jazz performance. Kim began her 20 year professional career with several dance companies. She has toured nationally and internationally with Black Box Theatre, Chicago Symphony Orchestra (CSO), Dance Chicago Touring Company ("The Stars of Dance Chicago), Dance for Life, LehrerDance, Koresh Dance



Company, Philadanco II, and Giordano Dance Chicago. At Giordano's Kim served as Assistant Associate Director and principal dancer for 12 years. Kim also danced for 6 years in the Radio City Christmas Spectacular as a Radio City Rockette. In her dance career Kim has had the opportunity to work with many renowned choreographers including Randy Duncan, Roni Koresh, Mia Michaels, Milton Myers, Davis Robertson, and the father of American jazz dance Gus Giordano. Ms. Fletcher-Stibal's was also the Artistic Director of Forum Dance Theatre (preprofessional youth dance company) for 8 years. While there, she was a member of Regional Dance America where her choreography won several awards. Her teaching and choreography has taken her all over the world as she has taught in several universities and festivals in North America, Asia, South America, and Europe. Some of her choreography can been seen on Giordano Dance Chicago (Chicago), Dancing in the Parks (Chicago) Extensions Dance Company (Chicago) and Ekaterinburg Contemporary Dance (Russia).

Company Dancers

Heather Baxter joined Portland Ballet in 2019. While at Portland Ballet her roles have included Olivia in A Victorian Nutcracker, Young Girl in Jen Jones' Surprised by Joy, and a Princess in The Firebird. Before returning to Maine she danced for two years with Roanoke Ballet Theater. She attended Point Park University where she received her Bachelor of Arts with a concentration in Ballet. She received her early training as a part of Portland Ballet's CORPS program. During her summers she has had the opportunity to train at many nationally renowned summer intensives including The Washington Ballet, Oklahoma City Ballet, and Dance Italia.

Erica Diesl received her early training at Acton School of Ballet under the direction of Kathryn Anderson and Walter Morris. After high school, she continued her education at the University of Utah and the San Francisco Conservatory of Dance, where she learned works by Jiri Kylian and Ohad Naharin, among others. After graduating from the University of Utah, Erica worked with Ballet Rox in Anthony Williams' *Urban Nutcracker*, and spent two seasons dancing with the Ballet Theatre of Maryland. With Portland Ballet, Erica has danced featured roles in *The Armed Man*, *Firebird*, *Napoli*, *Tales by Poe*, *Persephone & Hades*, and A *Victorian Nutcracker*.

Elliott Evans was born in Phnom Penh, Cambodia and has studied ballet since the age of nine with American Ballet Theatre Jacqueline Kennedy Onassis School under the tutelage of Franco De Vita. He then trained privately with Fabrice Herrault in NYC, The National Ballet School of Canada training under Sergiu Stefanschi and Raymond Smith. He then continued as a trainee with the Washington School of Ballet under the direction of Xiomara Reyes, Rinat Imaev and Mimmo Miccolis, where he danced in several productions with the Washington Ballet under artistic director Julie Kent. He has attended summer intensives at American Ballet Theatre and Fabrice Herrault both in NYC, English National Ballet in London, Canada's National Ballet School in Toronto, Sarasota Ballet, and Arts Umbrella in Vancouver. Arts Umbrella included repertoire by Crystal Pite, Ohad Naharin,

Jiři Kylián, Lukáš Timulak and Tom Weinberger. Elliott was awarded first place in both the professional classical and contemporary ballet category at the Washington Grand Prix 2021.

Jackson Gormley was born and raised on Long Island, New York where he began to dance at the age of 11, pursuing ballet more seriously at the Eglevsky Ballet where he trained under Laszlo Berdo and then Maurice Brandon Curry. Jackson went on to train at Ballet Academy East under the direction of Darla Hoover, while also studying contemporary dance under his teacher, Catherine Murphy. Jackson continued to pursue his dream of dance by attending Point Park University under the direction of Garfield Lemonius. Performing works by distinguished Jessica Lange, Jae Man Jo, Christopher Wheeldon, Adam Hougland, and Tyce Diorio. In 2021, Jackson joined Portland Ballet as a Company Dancer and has performed roles such as Helios in Shipman's *Persephone & Hades*, Cavalier and Nutcracker in A Victorian Nutcracker, and Firebird in Shipman's *Firebird*.

Kaitlyn Hayes began her dance training on Cape Cod, MA with Virginia Zango. She attended North Carolina School of the Arts for her final three years of high school, then went to SUNY Purchase College to earn her BFA in dance. Ms. Hayes joined Portland Ballet in 2013 and has performed many roles, including Olivia in A Victorian Nutcracker, the Detective in Tell Tale Heart in Shipman's Tales by Poe, and the title role of Alice in Roberto Forleo's Alice with the Portland Symphony Orchestra. This is Ms. Hayes' ninth season with Portland Ballet.

Since joining the company, she has had the opportunity to dance featured roles such as Persephone in Nell Shipman's *Persephone and Hades*, Dew Drop and Arabian in A *Victorian Nutcracker*, and The Woman in Jen Jones' *Surprised by Joy*. Guest Artists



Matthew Cumbie (he/him/his) is a collaborative dancemaker, writer, and artist educator. His artistic research cultivates processes and experiences that are participatory and intergenerational, moving through known and unknown, and bring a poetic lens to a specifically queer experience. His choreography- considered "a blend of risk-taking with reliability, [and] a combination of uncertainty and wisdom,"- weaves together a physical vocabulary of momentum and clarity, revelatory moments, and a belief in a body's capacity to meet every moment.

He has danced in the companies of Christian von Howard, Keith Thompson|danceTactics Performance Group, jill sigman|thinkdance, Paloma McGregor|Angela's Pulse, and Dance Exchange-an intergenerational dance organization founded by Liz Lerman- where he eventually became an Associate Artistic Director and the Director of Programs and Communications. Currently, he creates work with Annie Kloppenberg, Betsy Miller, and Tom Truss, and as a company member with Christopher K. Morgan & Artists. Matthew is also a Visiting Assistant Professor at Colby College, and is a certified practitioner of Liz Lerman's Critical Response Process. His work has been commissioned and supported by places like Dance Place, the Kennedy Center, and Harvard University, and by the National Endowment for the Arts, the DC Commission for the Arts and Humanities, the Arcus Foundation, and the New England Foundation for the Arts. Originally from Houston, Texas, Matthew holds undergraduate degrees from Texas Lutheran University and Texas State University and an MFA in dance from Texas Woman's University.



Tristan Koepke (he/him/his) is a dancer, educator, choreographer, and Rolfer®. He is currently a Visiting Assistant Professor at Bates College, and is Associate Director of the Young Dancers Intensive at the Bates Dance Festival.
